

Keynote Lecture: "Samuelson, Keynes and the search for a general theory"

Roger E. Backhouse is Professor of the History and Philosophy of Economics at the University of Birmingham and, since 2009, also at Erasmus University Rotterdam. He is presently working on an intellectual biography of Paul A. Samuelson, supported by a 3-year (2011-2014) Leverhulme Trust Major Research Fellowship. Other ongoing research covers Keynes, the history of the social sciences since 1945, and the history of disequilibrium macroeconomics.

Member of Editorial/Advisory Boards of *History of Political Economy*, *Journal of the History of Economic Thought*, *History of Economic Thought and Policy*, *Journal of Economic Methodology*, *Erasmus Journal of Philosophy and Economics*. For the years 1989 to 2000 Book Review Editor of *The Economic Journal*.
